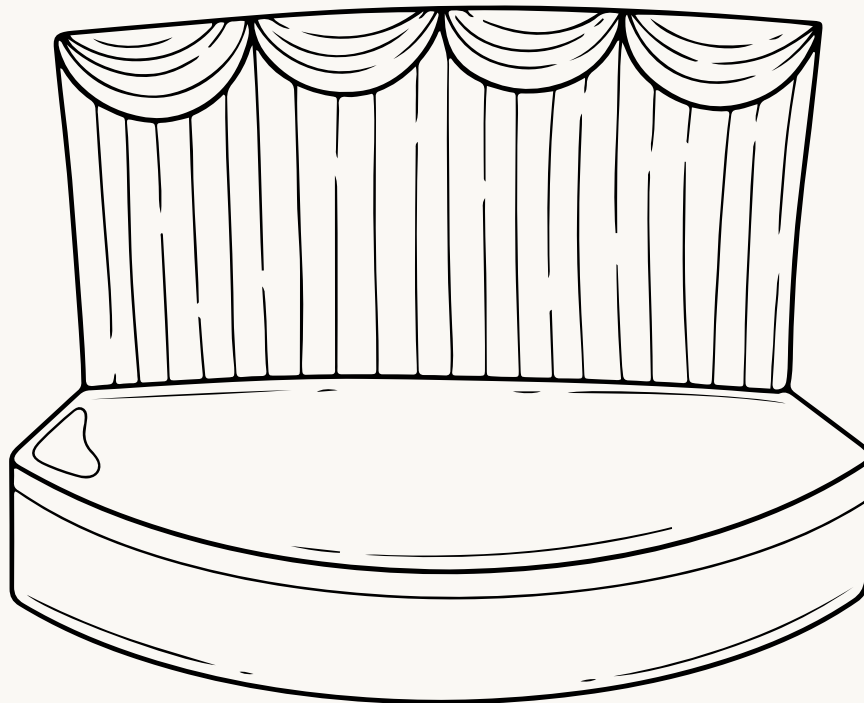

# Credits looks different in different contexts.



In movies , every role is listed.

In other contexts, crediting can be more informal, selective, or even overlooked.

So the main question is...

**“How do I decide if a contribution should be publicly and formally credited?”**

where..

- Inspiration blurs into appropriation
- Influence shapes contribution
- Authorship becomes a power negotiation

some guidelines...

Did the person give labor or  
time specifically to your  
project?

One-time or informal help → Acknowledgment

Ongoing input → Contributor credit



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## 03

Did the person contribute to the actual development or creation of the work?

Yes? → Consider formal credit (e.g., “dancer,” “dramaturg,” “composer,” etc.).

No, but they were an influence? → Consider an acknowledgment (e.g., “This work was inspired by...”).

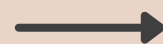

Was their contribution essential to shaping your final idea, concept, or method?

- If yes, that moves beyond inspiration.
- Consider crediting them as a collaborator or contributor.



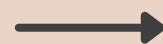

# What is the power dynamic between you and the person being credited?

→ can you have an open conversation with your contributors about if/ how they want to be credited?

→ Some people have more knowledge, institutional power / access to funding than others, can you help bridge the gap?

Because some folks have more access to power + visibility,.

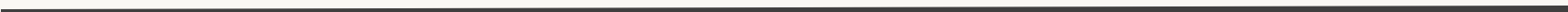
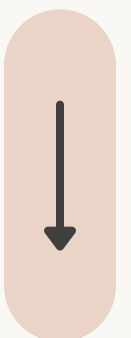
Crediting with care helps shift that — even just a little.
